Jim asks, "Sandra, have you ever been to Australia?"


She says, "No, I haven't. Have you ever been to Australia?"



"Yes, I have," says Jim. "I went to Australia with my family last year. Have you ever seen a koala?"


"No, I haven't," says Sandra. "Did you see a koala in Australia?"

The music at the concert was wonderful.





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
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
